FATE MAY HAVE TAKEN HIS EYES– BUT HE STOLE HER HEART THE MOMENT SHE HELD HIM.

It was just an average day at BHS when a man came into the shelter saying he had found a kitten on the side of the highway. He said it was in rough shape and he didn't think it had eyes. When I first saw the kitten, I was shocked. He was skin and bones, extremely small and maybe 4 months old at most. His face was covered in pus and his eye sockets were sunken and hollow looking. My heart sank for this poor kitten. Then something happened that made me think twice. As passed the microchip scanner over his back he stood up and started to rub his head and shoulders on it, purring faintly. That was enough to let me know that this emaciated and probably blind kitten wasn't giving up. He deserved a chance and thankfully BHS could give it to him.

Mr. Magoo was sent him over to the emergency clinic where the vet was hesitant to be too optimistic. She was openly concerned that if he did make it, he would almost certainly be blind; but even she was shocked at how alert and affectionate he was. I couldn't give up on him. He was a fighter. After a few days of round-the-clock care,

he was eating well and had won the hearts of the entire clinic staff. I decided to share his story on the BHS Facebook page in the hope that people would be as inspired by his strength as I was. The response he got was phenomenal. The response was immediate with an outpouring of love and donations to help pay for his medical care.

After his hospital stay I brought Mr. Magoo home to foster. Although he is almost certainly completely blind he is a perfectly normal kitten. He plays. He loves. He is fearless. He inspires me every single day. He has proven impossible to contain. I had set up my laundry room for him but he kept managing to escape. He fit right in playing with my other cats and even my dogs. He uses the stairs and jumps up onto the couch and bed with no trouble. My almost 2-year-old daughter has also fallen in



love with him and he loves to be carried around and cuddled by her.

His medical care is ongoing and he most likely will need to have surgery to remove what is left of his damaged eyes, but that isn't slowing him down. I'm hoping that he will be ready for his forever home by the holidays. I am so lucky to have met this kitten and so thankful to all of those who support the Burlington Humane Society. Your donations made helping this kitten possible. We couldn't do it without you! For those that are interested in updates you can follow Mr. Magoo's story on the BHS Facebook page.

# DAKOTA'S STORY

Dakota came to Burlington Humane after being found sitting on someone's front lawn. The kind person gave her some water and went to work thinking she was a neighbours pet. The woman called BHS to see if anyone had reported her lost since she was such a sweet and well-behaved dog. No one had, so she brought her to us in hopes that we could reunite her with her family. The clinic she went to discovered that she had no identification and she had a very large fat lump on her shoulder, was suffering from a bladder infection and required major dental work. It became evident that Dakota was probably dumped. Luckily, we could be her new temporary family and thanks to the wonderful people that donate to BHS we were able to fixed her up. Dakota came out of a long surgery with weight off her shoulder (literally!) and a fresh smile. The dental surgery alone took over 5 hours! She was feeling like a new dog! September 14<sup>th</sup> was



the day everything would change for the better for Dakota. The Gilbert family came in to the shelter to look for a dog. They described their ideal dog, and our adoption counsellor Heather knew Dakota would be the perfect fit. Dakota was still recovering from her surgery and not yet available for adoption but the family knew she was worth the wait. October 11<sup>th</sup> was Dakota's big day. It was a rewarding moment for the staff and volunteers of BHS because we knew her family would give her the love she deserved! Dakota's new family quickly posted an update on the BHS Facebook page letting us know Dakota was now queen of the house and that she is "the sweet girl [they] thought she was in every way!"

# Top 8 Holiday Pet Hazards

**Antifreeze** has a pleasant taste and very small amounts can be lethal.

Ice melting products can be irritating to skin and mouth.

**Christmas tree water** may contain fertilizers, which, if ingested, can cause stomach upset.

**Ribbons or tinsel** can get caught up in the intestines and cause intestinal obstruction.

**Electric cords** if chewed could electrocute your pet.

**Lilies** that may be found in holiday flower arrangements could be deadly.

Chocolate - the less sweet and the darker the chocolate, the more toxic it is to your pet. If ingested could cause vomiting and, diarrhea, elevated heart rate, abnormal heart rhythms, tremors, and even seizures.

Alcohol ingestion can occur quite easily during the holidays. Look out for signs of drooling, retching, weakness and vomiting.

She's constantly chasing her new best friend Maggie Mae, who we also adopted from BHS 6 years ago, although she's still a bit wary of my dog who likes to constantly give her kisses."


