# President's Message by Jolene Regan

This Fall is full of events that I hope you all will be attending. The Grand Opening for the new shelter at 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, September 14 will be a time to show off the new shelter and see how donations to the building fund have been put to good use.

Thanks to all who have made this new shelter a reality – we have had so many positive comments from those who have already been for a tour, and from those coming in to adopt an animal. It is truly a welcome place for the public and a safe and comfortable haven for the animals as they await their forever homes.

The annual fundraising event at Flamboro Downs will be held on Sunday, September 28. This is always a fun evening and your support is critical to our ongoing operations. And, the Howl-o-Ween Pawty will be held on October 18 at our new shelter. Join us for some FUN!

I have heard several comments that we have this new building – we must be really "rich"! Yes, we are "rich" in being able to build such a wonderful place for the animals! We have saved for over 10 years for this "dream" to come true, and been able to care for the animals also. The cost of running the building is very similar to the cost of renting our former premises, and with The Loft as an added contributor, we will be able to pay the building expenses. Your donations and support of fundraising events will continue to pay for the care of the animals, as always.

#### **Urgent news:**

Some of you may have heard of the proposed Bill 50: Provincial Animal Welfare Act, 2008. There are several sections of the Act that are contentious and on July 21, I made a presentation to the Justice Committee on Section 6 of the proposed Bill. That Section would give the right to the Ontario SPCA to designate use of the name "humane society" to those organizations of THEIR choosing. Many humane societies in Ontario, some affiliated with the OSPCA, and some independent, as we are, spoke out against this section. We were assured at that time that we would be "safe" from losing our name – the majority Liberal committee spokesperson Dave Levac stating "You can rest assured that the name will stay the same".

Comments from Garfield Dunlop (PC) were: "... it looks like the government is going to cave on this one particular area".

Comments from Cheri DiNovo (NDP) were: "Don't be snowed by spin". Unfortunately she was correct.

Amendments were made to Section 6, however, those amendments only appear to protect those humane societies who were affiliates as of April 3, 2008. Mr. Levac's (Lib) comments regarding those independent organizations that use the "humane society" name: "It's the courts that are now going to be carrying the load on decisions in terms of whether or not somebody can or cannot maintain their name".

Cheri DiNovo (NDP) comments: "Why do we have this section in? It does affect existing organizations. Why force those existing organizations to have to go to court? What is the point in that? They're going to take valuable money away from the good work that they do with animals to spend on lawyers. Is that in the interest of animals?". Garfield Dunlop (PC) comments: "....our party won't be supporting this either (the amendment to section 6)".

Due to our history over the past 6 years with the OSPCA and the Hamilton SPCA, we are sure this Bill, when passed, will impact us negatively.

What can you do? Write or phone your MPP and protest Bill 50. The bill will now go to the legislature for Third reading when it convenes on Sept. 23. We will continue to fight this bill also. The NDP and PC's will be voting against it. After hearing from other people and groups that have also borne the brunt of the OSPCA, this bill will only give the inspectors more power with no accountability. Should this be given legislative approval? Check out our website for more information.

We have been in the new Adoption Centre for 3 months now and it is everything I hoped it would be.

I cannot believe what wonderful dogs we have had in our care while waiting for their forever homes. I can honestly say there has not been one I wouldn't have gladly welcomed into my home if I didn't already have a full house. Getting our dog volunteers organized is a bit of a challenge since we do not always have dogs, but we are working on it. I think our cats and kittens are happy and healthier with lots of space and our cat display has turned out to be a wonderful source of laughter as we watch the kittens and cats play.

On the day we moved we had just gotten the animals over to the new Adoption Centre, when I got a call a volunteer had found a kitten in a box with 2 littermates. Unfortunately, the two littermates had died. They guessed the kitten to be just days old. We

quickly searched boxes for our supplies for hand feeding a kitten and luckily we found them right away. Everyone stopped what they were doing and we all watched this little kitten be fed. How cruel to leave kittens in a box to die in a parking lot. However, I am happy to tell you that little kitten, we named Lori is now thriving and very happy and a bit of a scamp to boot, thanks to

her foster Sue Tilley. That night I thought how little Lori was a metaphor for all the animals that will be saved with our new building.

ing, jewellery and crafts.


