## The Open Door

## A story about the benefits of microchipping your cat

Have you ever experienced that moment of panic when your indoor cat makes a bolt through an open door? To many felines, what lies beyond is a subject of infinite curiosity, and it is sad to say that in this case, curiosity can kill many cats.

We had such an experience with our elderly puss, Pudding, a black and white short-haired male we'd adopted from Burlington Humane back in 2005. He was 11 years old at that point in his life, and he found the adjustment to our home hard to take after living with an elderly lady in a quiet household. Suddenly he was faced with a couple of young cats and a rambunctious dog, and when he saw the opportunity to bolt, that is just what he did – through the momentarily-opened back door, between my husband's legs, and off he went.

We searched and searched, and with each passing day my heart grew heavier as I knew Pudding's chances of survival would diminish with all the perils he had to face out there. Not only did he have the challenge of finding his own food, he also had to face wildlife and traffic, all very hazardous to an unworldly older cat.

It is a sad statistic that very few cats ever find their own way back to their owners. Some people seem to have a misguided idea that every cat has an inbuilt compass and automatically knows its way home. Even if a cat desperately wants to be found, there is certainly no guarantee that this will happen, and in fact the odds are stacked very much against his chances of being reunited with his family.

That is why we at Burlington Humane always microchip all the cats and kittens that are adopted from our shelter. While it is no guarantee that a microchip alone will mean a lost cat will be found, if it is, the chances of it being reunited with

its owner are increased many-fold. Not only are microchips a requirement under our City's Bylaws, it is a great tool in helping a cat return home when it is found.



So, what happens to all those cats that never come home? A very lucky few are found and caught by caring strangers and brought to Burlington Humane, where they will be cared for and given any medical care that they may need. If we can identify their owners by means of the cat's microchip, these fortunate cats are reunited with their families. However, more often than not, they have to wait their turn at our shelter until someone else finds them and adopts them. Meanwhile their original owners are left puzzled about the disappearance of their beloved pet, and never know its fate.

But what of the rest? Those many cats that are killed by the roadside, no match for the roaring traffic; or who succumb to hunger and disease, to injury and a slow death in some quiet place, alone and unloved. What about those who desperately want to return to their family but instead end their days on death row, at a shelter where the pressure of numbers means that their future is counted in days from the moment they arrive there, unable to be rescued by the family that loves them because that family simply cannot be identified?

Please ensure that your cat is microchipped so that, in the unfortunate event that it does slip through that door that they see as a magic portal to an exciting world, with no idea of the danger, there is at least a better chance that you will be reunited with him if he is found.

As for our Pudding, we were eventually reunited, thanks to his microchip. I hope his days of wanting to explore the great outdoors are now a thing of the past. He is in his senior years now, but we are always very careful to be on the watch for a door inadvertently left open by some unsuspecting visitor.

Microchipping is a painless procedure for your cat. It is a sure way to identify it in the future, should the need ever arise. Please be a responsible pet owner and ensure that this simple step is carried out. See your Veterinarian if your cat does not have a microchip—it's the law in Burlington! All cats and dogs adopted from Burlington Humane are microchipped.

## **Adoptions Report**

Another busy summer is behind us and we are still overflowing with kittens!

From now until Christmas, we will have an abundance of stray cats and kittens. Many people get cute kittens for "free" with no real thought of how much it costs for veterinary care in the first year of a kitten's life. "Cute" kittens quickly turn into adults and within a year can become pregnant and are now unwanted. Many of those end up at BHS, unclaimed and unloyed.

Our foster homes provide care and love for pregnant cats with kittens until the kittens are old enough to be adopted, and then all are vet checked, vaccinated, dewormed and brought into the shelter. This has been a busy year for our foster homes with lots of kittens and even several litters of orphaned puppies! Even though it is only September, we still have pregnant cats coming in, so fosters will be needed for some time to come.



We would like to do a special Thank You to our foster volunteers. Taking in a heartworm positive dog and fostering through treatment takes patience and commitment. Handfeeding kittens and puppies is also demanding of one's time, but so rewarding. Fostering a pregnant mom is also rewarding and you get the pleasure of sharing your home, if only for a little while with newborn kittens and puppies.

If you have never been to the Adoption Centre, please drop by on September 19th for our Open House and Ruff Ride. We will be giving tours of the Centre and the adoption staff and volunteers will be on hand to answer questions about Burlington Humane or the animals. We are also open that day for adoptions from 10:00 am - 3:00 pm.

## Sally Fund

The Sally Fund, a specific charitable fund within the Burlington Humane Society, was set up to cover medical costs of homeless dogs from Southern Ontario. Dogs qualifying for treatment from the Sally Fund require extensive treatment for heartworm, injuries or sometimes both.

Since inception, the Sally Fund has successfully treated 22 dogs with five now in the treatment program for heartworm.



Unfortunately, **Zak**, one of the dogs in the program did not survive and passed away due to congestive heart failure. When Zak was picked up, he had a fractured hip, fractured and dislocated elbow that was going to require amputation, was heartworm positive and was so emaciated because he was unable to search for food. In spite of all his problems, he was very friendly

and sweet and everyone fell in love with him.

Surgery was successful on his hip and he was recuperating, but he could not start heartworm treatment until he was stronger. Zak was sedated for x-rays on his leg when he passed away. A postmortem showed 18 adult heartworms present. Adult heartworms can grow up to 12 inches and weaken an animal significantly.

Although we could not save Zak, at least his last weeks of life were in a safe environment with people who loved and cared for him. If he had not been found, he would surely have died of starvation.



LILY – heartworm positive and pregnant, had puppies in our kennel. After the puppies were adopted, Lily was successfully treated for heartworm and is now in her forever home.

**SIRIUS** had a leg injury when he came in and is now healed and he is in his forever home.

The Sally Fund is low on funds after treating so many dogs this year. Please consider a donation to the Sally Fund so that these special dogs can continue to be treated.


