Desperately Seeking Jenna



Jenna came to us on February 2, 2008 as a stray, obviously not a stray for too long as she weighed almost 30 lbs. We were sure someone would be looking for her, but no one

ever came forward. So, Jenna's health care was done and she came to the adoption centre on Fairview.

When Jenna arrived, she was very unhappy being caged, and acted out on those who cared for her – never biting or scratching, just being generally uncooperative.

Since moving to our new shelter and opening The Loft (our second-hand store), Jenna discovered a new place to spend her days. Every chance she gets, she heads to the Loft door and sits until someone lets her in, where the volunteers have made her a nice comfy bed and treat her like royalty! After her daily once over of the store, she settles in for a day of "supervising" and rest!

Several who work in The Loft have thought of adopting Jenna, but she has made it known that she doesn't like other cats or dogs, and most have other animals at home. Recently, Jenna was moved to the "playroom" from her double cage, so she could get more "exercise" when she wasn't in The Loft! We hoped this move would increase her chances of being adopted. But, Jenna continues her peculiar behaviour of swatting at anyone who shows an interest in her. Why? This is not the life we want for Jenna – she can be so sweet and would make someone a wonderful companion, especially someone who would enjoy taking a nap with her every afternoon!

Jenna is a beautiful calico girl, weighing 18 lbs, and needs to lose a few! She is loving, likes to talk, purrs very loudly when petted and loves people-watching.

We wonder if Jenna is so happy here that she doesn't want to go to a home. But, this is not the life Jenna deserves. Soon, she will have to go back to her cage, at least at night, as the playroom will be needed for litters of kittens. This is just not fair to her. As with all our animals, Jenna needs a forever home – where her "royal" treatment can continue!

After spending over a year with us, Jenna is now approximately 5 years old and her health care is current. She has watched almost 1,000 other cats go to their forever homes, yet she still waits to "choose" a favourite person of her own.

It hardly seems possible that we will be celebrating our First Anniversary at our new location. Over the past year, we have received so many compliments on the building itself and how great it is for the animals. We have also provided a location for several community groups to hold meetings and learn about the care of animals.

Looking forward, we will need to set up a type of "reserve" fund for future building maintenance. Due to the current economic turmoil, we are also looking at ways to cut expenses. Although the building is paid for, our operating funds are at a minimum comfort level. A greater presence in the community has interpreted into higher adoption numbers, but with additional adoptions comes higher vet costs. We never want to compromise the health care for the animals, but we never recover the vet costs in the price of an adoption. This has always been covered through donations.

Luckily, we have volunteers that are able to provide current maintenance, but are still looking for "a few good men" to help in that area. There are items that require monthly maintenance, and with spring/summer fast approaching, there will be lots more – including gardening (not just for men)!

We still have a lot of work to do – with a priority of acquiring some new and additional cat cages. Several of our cages have seen better days! Thanks to a recent donation for that purpose, we will be ordering some soon, but will still require approximately 30 more.

During the time of Michelle Swain's maternity leave, Judy Coney took on a special position to work on a smooth transition to our new building. Michelle decided not to return as an Adoption Counsellor, so Judy has now decided to stay on as an employee and therefore has resigned from the board. Judy's contribution to the board for over 20 years has been invaluable and her knowledge and expertise will continue to benefit the animals. Thanks, Judy for your dedication and love for the animals.

Many of you will remember Kay Toye who became a volunteer shortly after Burlington Humane organized. She was a board member for several years, a past president and volunteered until she became ill about 10 years ago. Kay passed away in January and our sincere condolences are extended to her family and friends. Kay continued to be a supporter even though she was no longer active.

Thanks to all who generously gave donations during the holiday season, and sent stories and pictures of your animals. It is a known fact that animals provide many health benefits to their owners, and we are so happy to be able to adopt many of those animals to their forever homes.

Adoptions Report

It hardly seems possible we will have been in our new Centre a year on May 1st. It has been everything we hoped for and more.

The beginning of this year we saw record-breaking adoptions during the months of January and February. I think one of the reasons is our new Sunday adoption hours – staffed fully by volunteers. It has been extremely successful with up to 10 adoptions on one Sunday afternoon! Thank you to those volunteers who have learned to process adoptions, and the receptionists who so willingly give up their Sunday afternoons.

Because the cats are being adopted so quickly, we were able to offer our help to Hamilton Animal Control and did several cat rescues during February. We have also taken some dogs from Lab Rescue who are rescuing a large number of mixed breed dogs. We also assisted Oakville Humane by taking 5 puppies from a rescue of 18 dogs/puppies. All have been excellent dogs and were adopted very quickly.

The Dog Playground is now complete and our dogs are enjoying the freedom of a leash-free romp. It is a fabulous space for them to enjoy these spring days. We continue to have some wonderful dogs who usually spend only a short time with us before leaving for their forever homes. We hope we can have another visit with them at Pooch Promenade.

Once again we are joining forces with The North Shore Animal League to participate in their Spring Adoptathon on May 2nd and 3rd. We are combining our Adoptathon with an Open House to celebrate our First Anniversary at Griffith Court. I hope you all come out to say hi, and if you haven't seen the new the Centre it would be a great time to visit.



Another sign of spring, we have 7 mother cats and their litters in foster homes! Could this be an early sign of spring? We hope so. If you have the time and space for a mom and litter, foster homes are always needed.

We are continuously looking at ways to improve Adoptions and make positive changes. New challenges have arisen with our new shelter and we are meeting them as always, with the best interests of the animals and the Society in mind.



On Jan. 28, we received an e-mail from one of our volunteers, Maxine Foxall. Maxine told us

she knew of a company willing to donate 10 pallets of litter to us if we could pick it up within 48 hours. We quickly contacted a transportation company to make arrangements, and Janice Farquhar got on the phone to get volunteers to help us unload.

On a very, very cold Friday night at 7 p.m. a tractor trailer pulled up to Burlington Humane absolutely full. 10 pallets had grown to over 52 pallets of litter, enough we believe to last almost 2 years! A very small but dedicated group of volunteers "handbombed" the litter off the truck and into our outside storage. There was so much we ended up storing some on our patio. It was midnight when a very exhausted and dusty group of volunteers finished. Now that is what we call animal lovers!

Thanks to Normerica/Northdown for the donation of litter and to Fluke Transportation for assisting us in transporting the litter to Burlington, as well as for their patience while they waited for the truck to be unloaded!




