

None of his bones or joints were quite where they should be, and at the beginning, it was unclear how much of his lack of mobility was from the physical deformities versus the



We began doing physio, laser therapy, and hydrotherapy. We got him a wheelchair as he had to build the muscles he needed to use. We booked orthopaedic surgery with River Glen Veterinary Services, who ordered the hardware from the UK that Spruce needed for his knees. Finally, on October 20th he went in for his first surgery.

In one long afternoon, they repaired both of his hind knees, fixed his umbilical hernia, and neutered him. His recovery has been going slowly, but each day is a little better than the last. How much more surgery we do remains to be seen, but despite it all, he's an inspiration in resilience and is an incredibly special boy.

The past year has seen a lot of positive changes at Burlington Humane. In March, we hired Verena Schleich, who has a comprehensive knowledge base working with animals. We now have a kennel full of stray and surrendered dogs, and even moved some into foster care while we find their forever homes.

We have also been able to recruit many new foster volunteers for cats, which increases the number of cats we can take in. Regardless of how much care and attention the animals receive at the shelter, there is no substitute for a home environment.

As people returned to work after the pandemic, we received many additional requests for surrender of animals, especially dogs. This has increased our need for foster homes. It takes a lot to be a foster volunteer and it is emotionally demanding. The reward of course is seeing their foster thrive and find their forever home.

With numbers of animals climbing, and the shelter filling up, everyone has gone above

and beyond to ensure that each animal is happy and healthy. Thank you to all of our staff for taking such good care of our animals. It takes a combined effort of volunteers to make the shelter and Burlington Humane run smoothly. The shelter alone requires many volunteers for feed and clean, dog walking, socializing animals, fostering, reception, transportation, and maintenance on a daily basis. Other volunteers for community outreach programs such as those who work at the second hand stores, pet therapy volunteers, education volunteers and fundraising volunteers all give generously of their time. A huge thank you goes out to everyone for all their efforts!

I also want to acknowledge our donors and supporters. We do not receive any government funding, so your support is vital. Thank you for continuing to believe in us and for supporting us so we can help hundreds of animals each year.

I want to wish everyone a happy holiday and a very healthy and prosperous New Year!

A New Era in Pet Therapy Post-Pandemic

Since 1984, our volunteers have faithfully been visiting local retirement and nursing homes in the Burlington area with their dogs and cats, bringing joy and companionship to isolated seniors. That all changed in March 2020, when the Covid-19 pandemic brought mankind to a standstill, workplaces shut down; schools closed.

Nowhere was the lockdown order more profoundly felt than in retirement and nursing homes where seniors were confined to their rooms, unable to see their families and friends.

The BHS Pet Therapy Program, meanwhile, was suspended indefinitely. At BHS, our hearts



went out to the geriatric community, and we needed to change to remain relevant.

With the assistance of healthcare workers, BHS began offering virtual pet

therapy visits. Some volunteers participated in window visits by visiting with their pets from outdoors at seniors' windows. It would be 1 1/2 years before therapy pets were again allowed back into retirement and nursing homes for in-person visits.

However, the number of volunteers started decreasing while demands for pet therapy services increased. Studies have shown the benefits of pet therapy and the positive effect on mental health, not only for seniors and the healthcare providers, but also at the workplace.

BHS has been recruiting new pet therapy volunteers to accommodate this increasing demand, offering frequent pet assessments with our professional animal behaviourist. If you have a gentle, sociable dog or cat at home, and can offer a couple of spare hours per month, we would really love to hear from you! Fill out an online volunteer application on our website.


